NATIONAL BOARD Supporting Educators to Become National for Professional Teaching Standards Board Certified Considerations

- Focus on a specific certification area or content, or support all certification areas:
 - o Literacy focused strand: (3-12 years) Literacy: Reading-Language Arts, (11-15 years) ELA, (14-18+ years) ELA
 - All certificate areas embed literacy support and impact student learning. Note: the only world languages that can currently pursue certification are French and Spanish. Other teaching/counseling roles align. Teachers must have at least 3 years of teaching experience, and school counselors must have at least 3 years of school counseling experience in order to pursue candidacy.
- Provide financial assistance with components:
 - Each of the four components costs \$475; annual registration cost is \$75.
 - Districts can set up third-party payment to pay NBPTS directly.
 - o Reimburse candidates for submission of part or all of component, or reimburse some or all of cost after certifying.
 - o Consider limiting financial assistance to one attempt, and expectations to stay in district for a certain time period.
- Provide release days to work on writing components and/or preparing for assessment.
 - Consider a day of release per component, and restrictions on when the days can be taken (for example not together)
- Utilize existing NBCTs to support candidates in cohort model, or work with NBCTs outside of your feeder/district if you don't have NBCTs or NBCTs interested in mentoring candidates.
- Provide training for mentors and/or candidates.
 - o Consider training mentors on updated process, ethics, and providing feedback.
 - o Consider providing training for your candidates on getting started, foundations, and writing.
- Stipend related to NBCT: Teachers must teach or mentor at least half of the time in their NBCT certificate area in order to receive the funding from KDE through the KYGA for the annual \$2,000 stipend (which is not fully funded by KYGA).
 - Consider assuring teachers they will remain in certificate area and/or they will continue to receive stipend from district regardless as long as keep NBCT status.
 - o Consider providing an additional stipend above the \$2,000 annual state stipend.
- Equitable access to accomplished teaching:
 - o Title II funds can be used to support NBCT; Title I funds can be used if the teacher is teaching Title I students.
 - Consider who will be/is impacted by your NBCTs. Is it equitable?
- Supplies and resources to support candidacy:

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- o Copies of the What Teachers Should Know and Be Able to Do Book, or the free PDF version.
- ATLAS subscription for the mentor to use to discuss accomplished practice with candidates as professional learning and/or to be used to support mentors in training to provide feedback.
- o Consider printing copies of each candidate's certificate area standards and directions.
- Videotaping equipment like a remote camera with microphone for shared use.

Example models:

- A large district designates and compensates NBCT Teacher Leaders in each school to support the candidates within that school. In addition, the district provides one release day per component, cohort support for both the candidates and mentors (mentor support led by district-wide NBCT Teacher Leaders), and an additional \$500 annually for NBCTs.
- A small district designates and compensates a NBCT Teacher Leader to support a cohort of candidates whose component fees are paid by the district. The mentor uses ATLAS and has been heavily trained to support candidates.
- A district embeds the foundational work of National Board into a district-wide three-year induction program. Teachers are encouraged and supported to continue in a district candidate cohort supported by a mentor once eligible.
- A district without NBCTs contracts a local mentor to support a cohort of candidates. During candidacy, the district encourages and supports future NBCTs to become mentors after certification.
