The Standards Studies are a reorganization of the National Board Standards into common themes to facilitate professional learning for all teachers across the educator career continuum.



As lead learners, principals can study the National Board Standards side by side with teachers using the Principal Standards Study. The Principal Standards Study aligns the Accomplished Principal Standards with the same topics of the teacher Standards Studies. As teachers have professional conversations around the common themes, principals using the Principal Standards Study can reflect on his or her ability to support the school on the chosen topic.
